## STATION PIER REFURBISHMENT WORKS MOORING BOLLARD AND FENDER UPGRADE AMENDED

**Date:** 06 September 2017

**Refers:** NTM 150 (T) and is cancelled.

**Details:** Port users are advised that refurbishment works will take place at Station Pier from Tuesday 23 May 2017 until approximately Wednesday 11 October 2017. Works will involve the installation of new mooring bollards and fenders at Inner West Station Pier (IWSP), Outer West Station Pier (OWSP), and Outer East Station Pier (OESP). Access to the IWSP, OWSP and OESP may be restricted during the period of works.

New mooring bollards will be installed at:

- Mid Pier between the 5 and 15 meter marks
- IWSP between the 345 and 360 meter marks
- OWSP between the 300 and 330 meter marks
- OESP between the 160 and 180 meter marks
- OESP between the 220 and 245 meter marks

New fenders will be installed between the 0 and 60 meter marks on the OWSP and OESP

Works will involve a crane barge, flat top barge, a crane punt and two work boats. All vessels will remain alongside overnight. Diving will take place in support of the works. The dive support vessel will exhibit International Code flag "Alpha" and buoys will be deployed to mark the dive site during diving operations.
